Volunteers at Minh Tam

Report of the mission at Minh Tam

Léa et Julie



We arrived in Ho Chi Minh City on 2 August 2012 after a long journey. With unconcealed hurry we arrived at Minh Tam and discovered the group of little monks.

The first few days have seemed difficult to us because of the total immersion: they did not speak two words English. So we had to communicate with gestures. Para verbal communication thus got its meaning. Indeed, we could not have imagined that a single glance could say that much!

Our days can be summarised as follows: we arrived early in the morning and we set up a workshop in English but the children quickly dispersed. Then we played with them, preferred games were dodgeball and French board games such as Coco Monkey, Infernal Scale or Jungle Speed. The scoobydooos have been also present, as well as painting which they particularly liked.



We had wanted to apply some water-based paint makeup, but attention, this is prohibited by Buddhist religion because you should not hide your identity.

We helped also with the preparation of the food, and we shared lunch with them. After lunch we did the dishes, and a bit of housekeeping. Then a nap was mandatory and after that we played again with the children until it was time to pray. We liked to pray with them and to share these moments. In the evening, we have not eaten with them, but in a "restaurant" near our hotel. Dish: omelet and noodles.

The hotel where we have slept was very clean and had air co! Phew, because it was hot all the time! On top of this, it was only a 10 minute walk from the orphanage.

Each day the children have impressed us by the solidarity that existed between them, a true sense of belonging to the same family could be felt. Because that is what the orphanage is like, a large family that seeks to compensate the lack of affection that could be felt by the children.

To describe them briefly, they are dressed in a single and similar outfit, and their shaven heads with little hair which gives a bit of color. Very beautiful.

After these good moments spent at the orphanage, we went to visit the north of Vietnam.

First we visited Hanoi, the capital, then the surroundings of Sapa and did a tracking that we really liked, and finally to sunny Halong Bay.

That were moments of relaxation we much appreciated, but we looked forward to seeing the children one last time. Full emotion we have returned to the orphanage before our departure. We waited for them until late in the evening because some of them had already gone back to school. And so it is in full force that we said goodbye to them, not easy after these beautiful moments of sharing.

We can say that it was a great adventure, very rewarding. The children have taught us a lot, especially humility, and it is with great sadness that we have left. Indeed, they were all so different and very interesting. We thought it would be possible to avoid to get attached, we have failed. Indeed, how to resist these small monks!



It is with sadness that we have written these few lines, and we recommend this experience to spend some time with couleur locale and to meet such beautiful persons.

Vu Lan festival in Minh Tam



9 septembre Vu Lan festival took place at Minh Tam. It is one of the largest buddhist festivals of the year and a good opportunity for people to remember their ancestors and to express respect for their grandparents and parents.

During this buddhist celebration, believers pay tribute at home at the altar of their ancestors. At the same time, they prepare at the entrance of their house a small altar, offering food and gifts for the wandering souls of the



forgotten dead. People participate in several activities too: pilgrimages, visits to pagodas, vegetarian diet, charitable activities, and offerings of votive paper for the dead. In Vietnam, this festival is no longer exclusively for Buddhists. It has become a tradition for everybody.

Children's day for the boys of Son Ky



First June is international children's day. For this occasion [LIN](#), Center for Community Development), had organised a trip financed by Media of Ho Chi Minh City and Cinebox to the cinema for the children of the orphanages we support. Only the boys of Son Ky were able to go, accompanied by our volunteers Coca and Marieke. They saw the movie: Mirror, Mirror about Snow White. Not the best choice, because it was in the original language and more for girls. The boys enjoyed the trip nevertheless, because they also received candies, crisps and soft drink. They came and went by mini bus, you say everywhere in Vietnam. We received the pictures too late to publish it in the last newsletter. We thank LIN for the invitation for this trip and Media of Ho Chi Minh City and Cinebox for financing it.



Various Cooperation with Les Amis du Vietnam



The associations Les Amis du Vietnam (Friends of Vietnam) in Marseille and the "Children of the Dragon" have signed a partnership agreement, formalising their joint action in certain projects. Les Amis de Vietnam has as its goal to let discover and maintain the Vietnamese cultural identity and to promote support in the social life.

For 2012, the Friends of Marseille contribute for the construction of 3 houses for very poor families in the village of Gia Canh in Dong Nai Province and funding of scholarships for the neediest students.

Walking sticks (2)



Further to the distribution in July, Marc went to a pagoda in District 8 in HCM this morning, where he offered 30 walking sticks to the elderly living there. 51 old people

among them 16 men and 35 women who share about ten rooms, 4 staff of good will, take care of them to the extent of their limited resources. There are also 6 orphans. From time to time, we bring medicines, spirulina ou other donations. Our activities are focused mainly on children in difficulties, so our activities here can only be ad hoc. We try nevertheless not to forget these elderly persons, often without family. Therefore, we would like to suggest to humanitarian associations who focus on old persons in the area of HCMC to take note of this address: Chùa Tịnh xá Ngọc Quang, Loại: Nhà Thờ, Tu Viện, 262 Lưu Hữu Phước, P 15, Q 8, HCMV.

Back packs for pupils in Hoc Mon



In the beginning of August Marieke represented our association when backpacks were given to poor children of a school in subdistrict Hoc Mon, District 12 in the north of

Ho Chi Minh City. Asked by the Trung tâm công tác xã hội trẻ em (Social centre for children), we have participated in buying backpacks. Some children also



received a scholarship, provided for by a company. Before the backpacks and the scholarships, doctor Le Van Nhan of the health prevention centre) talked with the children. He underlined the importance of knowing how to swim and explained how to avoid accidents caused by electric cables when there are



works on the way to school. It was an animated discussion and the children asked several questions. When the doctor asked who knows how to swim, the smallest answered "yes", because for them swimming is what you do in water that is 10 cm deep: play.

Back to school

In the beginning of September a small ceremony took place for back to school of the children of the primary school "Binh Hung Hoa B", Binh Tan District. We support the education of the poorest children by helping and encouraging them to continue their studies as well as participating in the purchase of material. The children received a dozen notebooks, some pens, 1 box of milk and a few treats offered by charity organisations.



"Binh Hung Hoa B" school was opened for disadvantaged families in Binh Tan District. There are 5 classes: lớp (class) 1 to 5 = (elementary school and first three years of primary school). There are 151 children that go to school for half a day. There are 48 children in lớp 1, 27 in lớp 2, 28 in lớp 3, 32 in lớp 4 and 16 in lớp 5. There are 3 teachers who earn each about 50.000VND (= 2 €) for half a day.

Scholarships for university students

We not only support pupils of primary and secondary schools, but also students who go to university or college. Two boys from Son Ky orphanage managed to pass the entrance exam for university. One of them, Tri, has started with the study information technology. Ngoc, the other boy, started the same study, but at a college, where the study is more practical. After three years at college he can finish university in one year. They will receive a scholarship for the duration of their studies. The cost of one year is about 35 million VND (= 1.400 €) including the fee for the university or college and daily costs of living. So not expensive compared with Europe, but considering that the average salary is 46 million VND (= 1.840 €) per year and that the minimum salary is about 12 million VND (= 480 €) and knowing that many persons do not even earn the minimum salary. Of course they are stimulated to find a small job, because that is good for their CV.

We wish the boys good luck with their study and we thank the sponsor of the scholarships.

Our orphanage

Meeting with Long An Province

A meeting with the authorities of Can Giuoc city, Lang An province, has taken place to define the three years' action plan. The municipality Can Giuoc issued a favorable opinion on our "orphanage" project. Present were: Mrs. May Nguyen Hong PCT (Vice-President), Can Giuoc Huyen, the representative of the Ministry of Agriculture and Environment, Rural Development representative, Mr Nguyen Hong Son (representative of the Red Cross = hội chữ thập đỏ Huyện Can Giuoc), 3 other members of the Executive Bureau of the People's Committee, Mr Vo Van Ba (President of the union of friendship organizations) and Ms. Loan, his assistant.



During 2 hours we developed our action plan. They will participate in our program already in place "access to clean water" in the region where it is very difficult to find fresh water due the high salinity of the rivers and in the one "a roof for a family" (houses of affection). The authorities have requested our participation with regard to the installation of a water treatment station for water that will be pumped into the river. The station will satisfy the needs of 800 families, meaning about 4,000 people.

Unfortunately due to the diversity of our actions and the amount of the project (approximately € 100,000), our association is not able to make promises. We will try to approach our networks to try to find help for them. The local People's Committee will participate for 50% of the amount of the works.

With regard to our project "orphanage" we have not been able to conclude anything, despite the favorable opinion for obtaining the terrain. The President of the People's Committee had not given our whole dossier to the Vice-President. We will study the project in detail at a next meeting. The municipality would like a school forms an integral part of the orphanage project.

This is our first partnership with this province. The contracts are being drafted.

Projects

Houses

In the middle of August Laura and Pierre-Yves, two French volunteers continued their trip towards Hanoi. They returned to the north of France in the beginning of September. The two students of the HEC Montréal, Camille and Estelle, left Vietnam at the end of August. We had organised a "goodbye" where we showed our gratitude to all these young people for their work and generosity. Unfortunately, the two Niçoises Julie and Léa, the volunteers at Minh Tam, could not participate in this ceremony as they had already left. Sylvain had designed a diploma to be offered to the volunteers. Laura, Pierre-Yves Camille and Estelle have financed and helped with the construction of houses in Gia Canh and Soc Trang. Mid September it was an early departure for Marc and Jenna, a young volunteer who had just arrived. She has come to spend 3 months with the children

(English and French courses and animation). This was an opportunity for her to learn about our activities. The morning began with the handing over of bicycles and encouragement scholarships for poor pupils in Gia Canh Commune, Huyen Dinh Quán, Dong Nai Province. This project is supported by 2 of our partners: BASAID and Friends of Vietnam. After this we met 4 families who will soon benefit from a house, bringing the number of houses built in 2011 and 2012 to 17 in Dong Nai Province.

A break at noon to share a meal with the representatives of the People's Committee (secretary and deputies of the party), the Red Cross, the organisation to encourage education, and the Fatherland Front. Then, for the first time to avoid repeating 5 times the inauguration ceremony, the beneficiaries of the new houses are gathered in the house of Mr. and Mrs. Đỗ Văn Ha in the presence of our partners listed before and Mrs Chu Thi Minh representative of the veterans (shot twice).

They finished the visits to the families while it was raining cats and dogs and in the mud of an epic trip on a track in the forest on motorcycle which Jenna probably will remember for a long time.

At the moment 17 houses are built in Gia Canh and 5 in Soc Trang. We will need to find funding to assure continuation of this program, because many families still need to be relocated.

Testimony of students of the HEC Montréal

Estelle et Camille



It all started with the idea of going to Vietnam to build a house for a family in need ...

Throughout the year, the group ABC (action bénévole communautaire = volunteer action in community) has organised many activities to raise funds for a mission during the summer. We are able to put together these funds through various events such as chocolounge, etc. Moreover, ABC is active in its community through local volunteers, organises campaigns to make people interested and is involved in several humanitarian projects.

To prepare us for this trip, we have done some research on Vietnam and received the support of Marc who was our contact and resource person throughout this adventure. We had to apply for a visa to enter Vietnam; we had the vaccines that we felt were important to protect us against certain

diseases. In addition, we took care to be well equipped for our stay there, because it would be hot in Vietnam.

Finally, the big day of our departure has arrived! We were two girls to leave on a mission that would take place from 24 July to 14 August 2012 at Gia Canh, located in Dong Nai Province. We left a bit in advance to be able to recover from the jet lag. When we arrived at the airport, we were fortunate to be warmly welcomed by a lady named Thuy, who is a French professor in Ho Chi Minh. We have slept at her house for two nights and that also allowed us to adapt to this new Asian environment.

Already, after a day in Ho Chi Minh City, we were off to the village where our mission would take place. We received a very warm welcome from the family that hosted us and it was with enthusiasm and joy that we have shared our first typical Vietnamese meal with them.

We stayed with local families and really, that is what made that we found this experience so rewarding. Not only because we met a wonderful family, with open-minded parents and especially very motivated willing to understand us and

to learn our language, but it also allowed us to really experience Vietnamese life and culture. We had brought a French-Vietnamese dictionary, and despite the fact that we did not have a translator, we were able to manage in communicating with them.

Regarding the house, we finally started the work a week later than expected. This represented a sizable adjustment for us, since we have the habit that things happen in a certain rhythm. Being here, we did not have the choice but to adapt to this. On the contrary, once everything had been set in motion, all was done in a very efficient way and the progress of the house went pretty fast. We had the pleasure to put a few stones and bricks here and there, under the direction of what appeared to be the foreman or the most experienced worker in construction.

Our team of workers was really nice to us, they were very funny, and they tried to communicate with us and we were making jokes... in Vietnamese! The family for whom the house was built took really good care of us and ensured that we felt at ease. On the other hand, although we have worked together with them, we have not been able to develop the same kind of relationship with them as with the family who hosted us.

At the end of the stay, we have been very happy to see that the house was almost complete. Unfortunately we could not see the house completely finished, but we knew that the rest of the stages of construction would take place and that the house would be completed. It made us very happy

to see the last picture of the house before making the trip back.

Finally, to conclude our stay in Vietnam, we made a brief detour to an orphanage to give toys to the children living there, and who appreciated this simple gesture.

To conclude, we are very happy to have had the possibility to have lived this unique experience where sharing was really visible. We have given, but we have also received a lot from the local people as well. We have emerged from this experience with a new perspective on the world, the knowledge of a new culture, a new reality and the discovery of another way of living. Certainly different, but it has as much value and enough to charm us in its own way.

We would like to thank the French association "Children of Dragon" for allowing us to experience this exceptional adventure, Marc, Mrs. Thuy and the two families we have met and who welcomed us at their house during our stay in Vietnam. To all of you, we say a big thank you!

Impressions of a foster mom and dad



Can you tell something about yourself?

My name is Paulo and I come originally from Agen. I am a former military like Marc and I was transferred to the Marne in the heart of the Champagne vineyards. My wife's name is Josiane.

My grandfather has lived in Vietnam a large part of his life, in the region between Hanoi, Haiphong, Hue, Cao Bang and the whole region with the high plains near the Chinese border. He was fluent in Vietnamese. He married an Indochinese, my grandmother who originated from Hue. She is a descendant of the Nguyen Dynasty (her maiden name is Nguyễn Thị biem). In my veins runs a bit of blue blood. My mother was born in Hanoi.

Since when are you a foster parent?

We are foster parents since October 2011 and since that moment no day goes that we do not think of her.

What made you decide to become a foster parent?

Talking with my brother about my intention to foster a girl he told me about this association, because he knew Marc very well during his military career.

Can you tell some more about what is it like to be a foster parent?

Solidarity must help those who need it most. Our action towards her is to help her within our possibilities to start her life well and to provide in her needs for training, education and her well-being. Additionally we will try to bring her the maximum of human warmth and love even though the distance and the language barrier are major obstacles.

Why did you choose Vietnam and the association the dragon's children?

These are the various reasons that made us decide to foster a little girl in Vietnam. Life is not perfect in the world but we believe that in Vietnam poverty is even greater.

Did you choose a boy or a girl?

Having contacted Marc by mutual agreement we decide to foster a little girl of the Truyen Tin Orphanage. Her name is Quynh Nhur. She will be nine years at the end of the year.

Did you already meet your foster child?

Not yet.

Will you visit her soon?

As soon as we will have the possibility we will visit her.

In what way do you communicate with your foster child?

When Tam is in Vietnam we use that opportunity to communicate with her through Skype. It is also

thanks to Tam and Marc who translate when we interact with her.

Can you tell us about your most moving moment?

What a wonderful moments to see each other and talk with each other directly. When we communicate with our foster daughter, it is very difficult for us to think about the other children who are not so lucky to have a foster dad or mom.

Do you have a tip for the other foster parents?

To foster a child at the other end of the world is above all a great affair of the heart and a choice that needs to be well considered, because you commit yourself vis-à-vis him or her to support him or her morally and to give him or her a quality education. According to an internet source there are thirty-nine million girls in the world who do not have access to education.

Do you want to share something else with the readers?

If you decide to join an association we advise you to turn to one that works on a voluntary basis and still has a human scale. You should be wary of large ones, because they require large costs for management, operating and exorbitant advertising costs. At the moment I am trying to convince my older brother to become a member of our association. But I think it is a waste because he is already part of seven humanitarian organisations. He has a lot of work and you have to understand that. We talk to others about our commitment and we sincerely hope to convince others to join our cause.

Impressions of a council member



Can you tell something about yourself?

My name is Stéphanie, I'm 36 years old and I am the mother of a little boy of 7 years. I live in Saint Saulve in the north of France. I am a Human Resources Assistant at the Clinique du Parc. I have a calm, reserved and sweet temper.

Since when are you the secretary of the association?

I offered my help in May in response to a posting I was put in touch with Mrs. Bailleul. Marc was just in the north of France. So I had the chance to meet the whole team at a meeting in June where I was formally elected treasurer.

What made you decide to become the secretary for an association for orphans in Vietnam?

I am already working for 15 years. Human Resources attracted me because of the human part, listening to employees, help them in the company. But for some time now I have the impression that my work is useless. That is why I decided to start this project: get involved as a volunteer with a humanitarian association and give time "so precious nowadays in our society" to those who need it most.

Have you already visited Vietnam?

No unfortunately, but I'll dream to go there one day.

Do you intend to visit Vietnam in the near future?

In the near future I do not think so, it will be complicated. When Baptiste, my 7 year old son, will be bigger and my finances will allow me to go, why not.

Can you tell something more about how it works to be the secretary of an association that works in Vietnam while you and most members of the council live in France?

Theoretically, the treasurer shall – according to the statutes – trace the objectives of the spending to achieve the activity program, prepare the provisional budget of the association in line with the objectives in the short, medium and long term, and propose objectives to be achieved with regard to the resources. There are other responsibilities in the statutes, but for now I have to confess that I am far from fulfilling all these tasks. I am currently putting in place a computer program for the accounting which till now was done on paper. I take care of the bookkeeping tasks (expenses-revenues). I am also the back office for promised funding, and I deposit checks at the bank.

I am a new in this field, I advance with small steps, I am supported by the whole team that gives me a lot of information. They are always available and are not stingy with advice, we are a good team.

Even though you have started only recently, can you tell us about your most moving moment with regard to the activities for the association?

The most moving moment is not about my work as treasurer, but as a foster mother. I was very touched to see the face of my foster son. He was born in the same year as my son. I am very proud to be part of his life and he of mine now. All the pictures that I could find on the site also moved me a lot, especially the photos of student volunteers dressed as clown, the smiles of the children upset me.

Can you tell us if you have encountered difficulties with regard to the activities for the association?

Difficulties, not really. Perhaps the mails, Marc is very active, I spent a lot of time trying to read all, and especially to understand everything, I realised later that you should not be distracted and focus on one's mission. Especially when you work during the day and as we have a little boy at home.

Can you already tell us about the most important or most impressive achievement with regard to the activities of the association?

I would say the preparation of the annual financial report for the General Assembly in December. But as I said before I am a beginner and I have only recently become part of the team, so it is quite normal to be a little lost at the beginning. But as Mark says "relax", he manages a lot of things and sees everything. I can count on his experience and availability, which is really a pleasure.

Do you have a tip for the members, foster parents and volunteers?

Simply: do not hesitate.
